# Author encourages Greenhill students to pass it forward

Greenhill School faculty and staff are celebrating Random Acts of Kindness Week in myriad ways.

Cards saying "pass it forward" are being given to people to sign and pass on. All three divisions are participating in age-appropriate activities to remind everyone of the importance of kindness. Greenhill's principles of honor, respect and compassion are at the center of the activities.

Greenhill welcomed renowned author and speaker Jackie Waldman, who has just completed a speaking tour of 150 cities. She has spoken with numerous groups about her philosophy of giving. Waldman was living the picture perfect life with three healthy children, a loving husband and a successful business.

Then, in 1991, she was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis and felt her entire world collapse around her. She reached a turning point after seeing the movie *Schindler's List* with a close friend

Inspired and touched by the story, Waldman realized how one person's acts of kindness could make a difference. She thought about how she was treating herself and those she loved, and she realized that true survival was not

whether her legs worked.

"True survival was about how we treat each other — about love and acts of kindness, no matter what," she said.

Waldman and a friend were the organizers of Random Acts of Kindness Week in Dallas, as part of the National Random Acts of Kindness Month.

The week was a huge success, with participation from Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King III, W. Deen Mohammed and Dennis Weaver, all of who spoke at rallies, schools and interfaith services. The Dallas Police Department even participated by passing out Kindness Citations. Dallas still celebrates Random Acts of Kindness Week.

Waldman spoke to the Greenhill upper school Valentine's Day. She shared her story and several other stories that are included in her five books. She also addressed the entire faculty and staff.

Jackie and Steve Waldman's two sons, Todd and Michael, graduated from Greenhill and their daughter, Melissa, was a teaching fellow at Greenhill.
